2022-2023 Priorities for Improvement
<p><b>1. Ensure that consistently high quality teaching is maintained, retaining a key focus that enables children’s outcomes in the Prime Areas to further improve across the nursery, particularly:</b></p> <p><b>A Develop children’s independence skills and continue to focus on the importance of Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)</b></p> <p><b>B Develop children’s communication and language skills, including the use of emotional literacy.</b></p>
<p><b>2. To ensure all groups of learners have the opportunity to experience and understand early mathematical concepts through the prime areas.</b></p>
<p><b>3. Continue to work with a wide range of stakeholders and Early Years professionals to make a positive impact on the sustainability of the Nursery School.</b></p>
<p><b>4 Further develop a safeguarding culture across the whole school.</b></p>
Next steps for the school from last Ofsted inspection – March 2019
<p>1. Leaders and those responsible for governance should ensure that they have a precise understanding of how the provision for two-year-olds can be developed even further. <i>(implemented)</i></p>
<p>2. Leaders and those responsible for governance should ensure that information included in children’s two-year-old progress checks is equally as comprehensive as other nursery record for these children. <i>(Completed March 2019 – is fully and consistently implemented)</i></p>
