<ol> <li>Ensure that consistently high quality teaching is maintained, retaining a key focus that enables children's outcomes in the Prime Areas to further improve across the nursery, particularly:</li> </ol>
A Develop children's independence skills and continue to focus on the importance of Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)
B Develop children's communication and language skills, including the use of emotional literacy.
2. To ensure all groups of learners have the opportunity to experience and understand early mathematical concepts through the prime areas.
3. Continue to work with a wide range of stakeholders and Early Years professionals to make a positive impact on the sustainability of the Nursery School.
4 Further develop a safeguarding culture across the whole school.

## Next steps for the school from last Ofsted inspection – March 2019

1. Leaders and those responsible for governance should ensure that they have a precise understanding of how the provision for two-year-olds can be developed even further. *(implemented)* 

2. Leaders and those responsible for governance should ensure that information included in children's two-year-old progress checks is equally as comprehensive as other nursery record for these children. (Completed March 2019 – is fully and consistently implemented)
